
Atidaynu News



Jackie's Book Review by Jackie Cohen

The Elephant and My Jewish Problem by Hugh Nissenson

This eloquent and carefully constructed compendium of Nissenson's previously published fiction and his journal excerpts, dramatizes the Jewish experience during the 20th century in America, Europe, and especially Israel. His stories confront the Jewish quest for faith and redemption in dire circumstances, especially in the face of evil.

Nissenson lived on and off a kibbutz near the Golan Heights from 1965 to 1967, the era of fortress Israel. He covered the Eichmann trial in Tel Aviv in 1961 for Commentary Magazine.

The demonic and degrading atrocities that Holocaust survivors endured demonstrate Israel's crucial need for existence. One example recounts a

beautiful 16-year-old girl, snatched from the prisoner line, sterilized and thrown into a Wehrmacht brothel with "For Officer's Only," tattooed on her belly. In excerpts from his journal of the trial, he tells Martin Buber, "Don't try to grasp the meaning of evil revealed at this trial with your rational mind alone."

From his life on the kibbutz, he immerses us into a stark reality of war with an almost hourly description of the tension and fear from Israeli bunkers. He travels the Golan with soldiers after its capture describing the scene of a shelled Syrian village, strewn with bloated animal corpses, and dead children who look like they are still asleep. He converses with young Israeli soldiers in the bunkers who leave for battle and are killed.

Through the everyday, commonplace activities in Jewish peoples' lives, particularly Israelis, he reveals the deeper struggles of faith, apropos for Israel, whose interpretation mean God wrestler.


